

Suraraj in India

ur partner Suraraj is passionate mission partner of H.I.M. He

is planting house churches for the unreached people group in the villages in eastern India. He continues to build relationships through the day care centers he is operating and the Teach For Odisha hostel for secondary students. With H.I.M. support, Suraraj opened a garment shop (Mercina Garments) to help sustain his family and ministry. Mercina Garments is now a thriving business in the local market and working on competing consistently other businesses. The peak time for his business is during the Hindu Dussehra Festival in October and the Christmas Season in December. Prasad's Investment

ur partner Prasad is second-generation missionary in India. His parents have been in ministry for over 50yrs. Prasad's mission work is growing in the remote throughout villages India where most are unreached people groups. His vision is not only caring for the orphans, growing the house churches, and spreading the gospel throughout India, but growing the livelihood initiative. H.I.M. gave a seed investment for one of the local pastors and his wife to start a goat farm to support their family. The livelihood project started last year with 10 goats to support new Christians, and now they have more than 16 goats.

Three village women are helping care for the goats and they are selling the goat milk at the market. Prasad has a vision of helping new believers come out of poverty by growing the Livelihood Initiative to start chicken and cow farms as well.

Vinay's PAVE Ministy

ince 2007, Vinay has been empowering the poorest communities of North and Central India. His ministry. People in Action for Virtuous Empowerment (PAVE) is a Christian Non-Governmental Organization. PAVE supports people in India by providing care for the whole person; social, emotional and spiritual well-being. The partnership with H.I.M. helps raise funds for struggling pastors to start businesses. By helping pastors become self-sufficient allows them to share the Gospel to the manypoorandunreachedpeople in India. A computer business center, garment & tailoring shops, taxi & e-rickshaw, and a dairy farm are just a few of the businesses that we have helped start. TEACHING SKILLS TO NEW BELIEVERS



Naeem and Ruby in Pakistan

aeem and his wife Ruby are serving the Lord in Pakistan. Despite the threats of death and constant persecution, Naeem and Ruby have been sharing the Gospel with tremendous courage and

wisdom. In Northern Pakistan they teach and disciple new believers through their Through social programs. the livelihood initiative, they address the issue of poverty in communities by teaching women the skill of sewing and tailoring clothes. They

are also distributing sewing machines to help women start their own business. With support from Naeem and Ruby, families have been helped with starting goat and cow farms. The sale of milk supports their families and others in the community.



HYDERABAD SCHOOL TEACHES TAILORING

PK Moses Reducing Poverty

astor PK has a great passion in seeing the reduction of poverty in his community through his sewing school for women and a computer class for young people. PK's church is located in the slum of Hyderabad. With his leadership of livelihood initiatives, poor receiving women are needed skills to start a business and earn a living. At graduation from the school, they receive a new sewing machine to start their own business. As the women learn tailoring skills, they are also listening to the story of Jesus. In August of this year, 11 women graduated from the tailoring school. These women are happy and blessed to have



the training in the school. PK's wife is also involved, and she shares the love of God to the students. There are currently 12 women enrolled in the 100-

day class (about 3 and a half months). Teaching these women a skill will assist in keeping them safe from human trafficking.



BUILDING CHURCHES ACROSS THE GLOBE

partners, along with H.I.M, advance the Gospel in mostly unreached and impoverished nations around the world. Together, we are dedicated to helping the poor, sick and unreached. There are currently more than 1,500 churches across the globe that we have assisted, and we continue to enable others to build churches in countries such as Nepal, Pakistan, India, Nigeria, Philippines, Zambia, Bangladesh and many others. We are excited to share with you a few of the stories from our partners and friends.

Sanga in Bangladesh

ur partner Sanga is working among some of the unreached indigenous tribes in remote villages of Bangladesh. His church planting work has continued to grow, and his outreach ministry is bearing



fruits among the Mru, Khumi, Khiang, Tripura, Chak and Chakma tribal groups. God is using his ministry to bring the gospel to these unreached people of Bangladesh.

Sanga has seen the rising level of hostility and restrictions by the government on religous

beliefs and practices in the country. However, amid the resistance, the Lord is opening the hearts of the people for the Word of God. New believers are eager to hear the gospel and are coming to the Lord. Most of these new believers can't read or write, and some of their languages have no written script. Sanga and his team have translated several books and worship songs into the local languages. They have organized medical outreaches distribute medicine as well as distributed clothes in the villages. This has been very effective in reducing superstition and has allowed Sanga to gain trust of the villagers. Through his work he has touched the hearts of the unreached people.

GROWING NIGERIAN CONGREGATIONS



Albert in Nigeria

he year 2022 has been a year of amazing church growth in Kaduna Nigeria. The church auditorium expansion project was started earlier this year and then another expansion project was carried out several months later

to accommodate the growing congregation. A revival is certainly going on with people traveling from outside Kaduna to come worship. More than 120 people have given their lives to Christ in the first half of this year. The Church has grown from 200 to over 400

people and the building can no longer accommodate them. Worshipers are sitting outside in overflow, make-shift canopies during worship.

The village churches in Kebbi and Niger states in North Western Nigeria are thriving. Recently our team visited the field to teach the local church leaders. deliver the motor bikes to the Pastors that were purchased for them by H.I.M., as well as distributed clothes and shoes to the villagers. These villages have been neglected by the government and are regularly persecuted. Since they chose to become Christians, their communities have no clean water, accessible roads, electricity, or schools provided by the government. The church is now helping the village children with a school in the church.



CHRISTIAN RELIEF FOR THE POOR

Diku in India and Nepal

iku is carrying on the ministry started by his father in the Northern part of India and Nepal. He and his family operate a Christian school which has earned him the trust and respect of the Muslim neighbors. They take care of two churches; one is at his house. The two churches, which are located on the Nepal border, need a proper place of worship. They have been serving their community with education programs and providing relief materials for the poor. Their ministry is thriving among both Muslims and Hindu worshipers. Diku is a gifted musician and with a love for children, he provides them with snacks and teaches them songs as he shares the gospel.



Ramayon in India

he Shalom Ministry Centre in India was established by our partner Ramayon and his wife Rimis to care for rural children sent to the city for school. They built a hostel for girls to provide them a safe place to stay as well as to receive support for their spiritual and physical

needs. They host classes and provide a feeding program for other children in the community.

Ramayon recently baptized 16 new Christians that are now actively involved in the church. Ramis and Ramayon along with their family are respected Christian leaders working among the Naga people of India.



MUSIC AND LITERATURE OUTREACH



Pastor Lawrence

he ministry of Pastor Lawrence is a family calling and their labor of love in the community attracts thousands all over India. He has trained dozens of pastors who are leading house churches in dozens of communities and villages across India. Their influence in the community is tremendous.

Lawrence and his children lead worship through Christian gospel music and have recently released an album that has reached over 284,865 people.

They reach 30-50 thousand people through their Facebook Live program where they share the word of God. The friendship and trust between Lawrence and Fred is more than 40 years. In 1983 Fred gave Lawrence \$25 to purchase a small parcel of land. This small investment has now grown to include a home and Ministry Center for thousands of people. Please pray for the medical challenges and needs for Lawrence and his family

Surendra in Nepal

urendra has an organization that monitors the cross border in Nepal against trafficking of vulnerable girls for prostitution. He helps them and leads them to Christ. Surendra's passion is seeing Nepali Christians have access to Christian literature. This has led him to translate the Kingstone Bible that includes 12 Books. This is a graphic adaptation of



the stories in the Bible. Since most unreached people in Nepal cannot read. He has also translated two books by Roy Hession, "We Would See Jesus" and "When I Saw Him"



into the Nepali language. Surendra's ministry is committed reaching remote villages Nepal, distributing audio Bibles to the local villagers and handing out picture Bibles to children in the area. Many lives are transformed through their mission. His ministry partner Lucky is filled with zeal and passion to reach out to the people with the gospel in the streets of the capital and several other cities outside Kathmandu.



FROM VICKY'S HEART

hy does Heartland International Ministries (H.I.M.) exist and is it still needed?

Of course! HIM started in 2001 with a heart and their sites on the unreached people across the globe. There was a need for a mission organization to help Indigenous Christian pastors reach the unreached in their countries. Having an accountable agency to be a part of, and to be able to receive financial support for their ministries was desperately needed. There are a lot of mission agencies that help American missionaries go to other countries to serve the Lord there. Before these missionaries can really serve in other countries, they need to spend a lot of time

learning the language, culture and customs. HIM exists so that indigenous Christian workers can minister to the people in their own country. They can start serving the unreached and their communities right away. Of course, HIM has a few American workers who leave the U.S. to serve in another country or are serving here in the states. But most of the PALS are nationals in other countries.

It's been exciting to see how a few indigenous partners, working under the wing of H.I.M., have had such incredible growth around the world! What a blessing to hear the stories of these pastors/workers that have discipled so many others and caused the work of the Lord

to grow and reach even more people for Jesus Christ!
